

# BASIC INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM

## Background

The curriculum will meet the requirements established by the School Act, the Regulation, and the directives of the Ministry of Education. The provincial prescribed curriculum developed by the Ministry of Education forms the basic program of studies for most students. In addition, as permitted under the School Act, the District will provide a number of locally developed courses designed to allow individual schools to be responsive to the particular needs of students in their communities.

The ultimate aim of all instruction in District schools - the basic program required by the Ministry as well as the locally developed programs - will be consistent with the Mandate of the School System, (OIC 1280/89), namely, to achieve the “Educated Citizen”, defined as the intellectual, human and social, and career development of every student. Educational outcomes must also adhere to the BC Tri-partite Education Agreement (BCTEA).

The District provides instruction to teach English to students who have a language other than English as their primary language. The District also provides instruction designed and adopted for exceptional students.

## Procedures

1. Various instructional programs - elementary as well as secondary – are to be developed with the view toward creating a balanced, integrated, and carefully sequenced curriculum that will serve the educational needs of all school-aged students in the District.
2. The District shall support school staffs in developing learning resources to facilitate implementation of new and revised curricula and to respond to local needs for curricular materials.
3. The District supports a reciprocal relationship with other educational jurisdictions, wherein locally developed curriculum materials are shared.
